Unite lockups

The lockups should always be used on a white background. There is a background frame as part of the logo, which should be used at all times.

There are 2 primary lockups available. English and Te reo Māori.

The lockup text must always remain right aligned and never have parts of it removed, altered or spacing changed within it.

Coloured and photographic backgrounds

Because the lockups are always used on a white background, it means we can be more flexible on different kinds of background colours and textures.

When using the lockup on a photographic background, it should never be placed over people's faces.

Minimum size, clearspace, and alignment

Minimum size

The minimum size for the logo in print is 12mm high.

For digital applications it can be smaller, with a minimum height of 80 pixels high.


For social media profile images it can be used smaller, but should be checked on a case-by-case basis.

Minimum clearspace

The lockups minimum clearspace is based on the height of the yellow strip. It should be applied equally on all sides of the lockups, from the edges of the white frame.

Alignment

Any logos, text or imagery that need to be aligned to the Unite against COVID-19 logo should use the lower edge of the yellow strip as a baseline.

Please note that the purple should only be used for vaccine related communications.




Traffic lights


The COVID Protection Framework uses three colour settings, Red, Orange, and Green, to indicate the response we take against COVID-19.

These colours should only be used as indicators for the framework, and not as general brand colours.

There is always a thick white outline (~6pt on A4) added to the circular indicators when used against a coloured background.









Typeface

Heading size, weight and colour may vary depending on the document needs.

Point size and colour must comply with accessibility standards AA. Make sure there is enough contrast and the type is not too small (recommended minimum size is 11pt). Caps should be used at a minimum and never in headlines.

The main typeface is **Omnes**. It is a paid, licenced font and comes in wide range of weights and is used for headlines and body copy.

The main weights that we use are shown here.

For website and online communications the typeface is **Baloo 2**. This is a free Google font that can also be used when the Omnes licence does not apply.

The default font for Word and other Microsoft Office programs is **Segoe UI**.

Stripes


The Unite against COVID-19 stripes were a main feature in our visual identity until the implementation of the COVID Protection Framework (traffic lights) on 3 December 2021. They remain a core element of our brand and are still acceptable in existing resources, though we now use them sparingly.

The stripes can be used in a range of shapes, the optimal amount of stripes is 5 to 6. The top left and bottom right corners of the frame should have equal parts of a stripe in them to make the corner shape yellow rather than white.

There should be a white border between the stripes and the edge of frame or page at all times.

The stripes may be used in UAC yellow, white or vaccine lavender (see vaccines style guide for details).





Sails


Implemented at the launch of the COVID Protection Framework (traffic lights) on 3 December 2021.


Sails can be used in a range of sizes and shapes, the most common of which is 4 or 6 in a rectangle. It is not recommended to go beyond 8 sails in a layout. There should be a white border between the sails and the edge of frame or page at all times.

The sails should be a mix of tints, usually chosen from 0%, 20%, 40%, 60% and 100% of a brand colour. The order of the tints is not set, but the use of official templates is recommended.





Icons

The Unite against COVID-19 brand has a range of icons that have been created specifically for use in our resources and messaging.

Often specific icons are attached to particular themes or messaging. If you have concerns about which icon to use, please contact the brand team.

Icons can be used on any background, but ensure the fill of the icon remains white. The icon itself remains black in most cases, with exceptions only for official engagement tools and specific audiences.


For Māori audiences, we also have a set of icons that feature a patterned border - the same colour rules apply.


